PRO-JECT DEBUT III/ORTOFON OM5E £130

The price says it all. For just £130 you get an excellent budget turntable with aluminium tonearm and Ortofon OM5E cartridge. The Debut III simply trounces similarly-priced CD players where all the important aspects of music making are concerned. It offers a taut, sprightly and well-focussed sound, while low frequencies are full-bodied in the classic vinyl manner, with not a hint of bloat or lethargy. In the midrange, voices are given ample room to breathe and treble frequencies are crisp and attacking. This deck is a stellar performer and remarkable value for money.



BEST FOR JAZZ

PRO-JECT RPM5 £400


Pro-ject's budget Debut series has made the entry-level discspinner range its own (see above), and we reckon the RPM5 is good enough to do the same in the mid-priced area. It's a well-thoughtout package: your money buys a nicely finished and well made deck, complete with a carbon fibre tone arm. You'll also need to buy a cartridge: the £50 Ortofon 510 works well, and is what we used during testing. In use, the RPM5 delivers all the detail you can reasonably expect for the money in a very musical manner. Our Product of the Year in 2006 and still a fabulous piece of kit.



BEST ALL-ROUNDER

CLEARAUDIO EMOTION £690

We made the Emotion our Product of the Year turntable in 2004 and 2005, and with good reason. It continues to thrill and delight everytime we dig it out - it's lovely to behold, beautifully built and sounds superb, delivering a level of musical fidelity a CD player costing four figures would struggle to match. The Emotion is a dynamic, detailed listen, fully in touch with the emotional and mechanical aspects of your music. It may look like a Philippe Starck frippery, but the Clearaudio Emotion is a serious and purposeful proposition. If you want your turntable to look as good as it sounds, try this.



BEST FOR **STYLE**


ROKSAN RADIUS 5 £850

Trust Roksan to do things differently. The Radius 5 might look like a stylish but conventional deck, but under the skin you'll find gems of engineering that trace their roots all the way back to the company's first ever product, the Xerxes turntable. The deck is arranged in layers, to minimise vibration, and the motor is very compliantly mounted to even out any speed irregularities. As a result, the Roksan Radius 5 is a stormer, with a level of control and resolution that few can match. Have no doubt, this is a magnificent piece of engineering and worth every penny. We love it.



series, and has an advanced version of the Satisfy tonearm with a carbon-fibre arm tube and single-piece wiring from cartridge to amplifier. Delivery is clear, detailed and pure-sounding product, but it's too restrained for our tastes.

---> VERDICT

This is a very fine deck that's really easy to admire, but a little harder to love; needs more drive and punch
